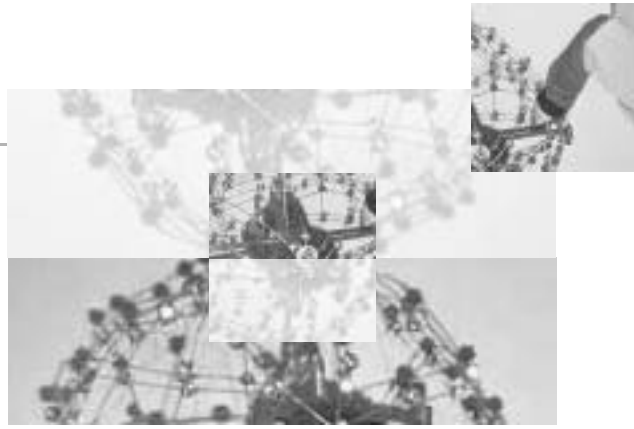

## Ken Smith

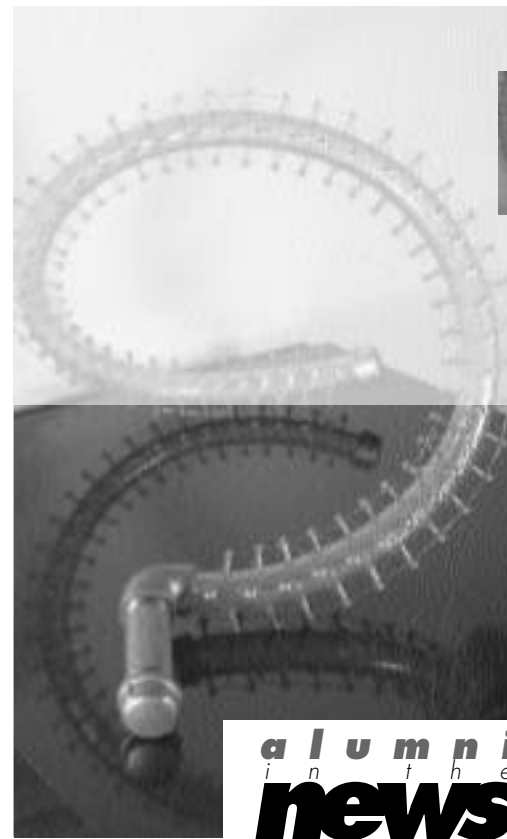
has been accepted to UCONN, and plans to major in graphic design.
